

School districts receive funding from different sources: state funds under the Local Control Funding Formula (LCFF), other state funds, local funds, and federal funds. LCFF funds include a base level of funding for all LEAs and extra funding - called "supplemental and concentration" grants - to LEAs based on the enrollment of high needs students (foster youth, English learners, and low-income students).




This chart shows the total general purpose revenue San Lucas Union Elementary School District expects to receive in the coming year from all sources.

The total revenue projected for San Lucas Union Elementary School District is \$1,425,258.67, of which \$790,276.00 is Local Control Funding Formula (LCFF), \$101,270.98 is other state funds, \$197,822.77 is local funds, and \$335,888.92 is federal funds. Of the \$335,888.92 in federal funds, \$88,730.00 are federal CARES Act funds. Of the \$790,276.00 in LCFF Funds, \$190,501.00 is generated based on the enrollment of high needs students (foster youth, English learner, and low-income students).

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For the 2020-21 school year school districts must work with parents, educators, students, and the community to develop a Learning Continuity and Attendance Plan (Learning Continuity Plan). The Learning Continuity Plan replaces the Local Control and Accountability Plan (LCAP) for the 2020–21 school year and provides school districts with the opportunity to describe how they are planning to provide a high-quality education, social-emotional supports, and nutrition to their students during the COVID-19 pandemic.



This chart provides a quick summary of how much San Lucas Union Elementary School District plans to spend for planned actions and services in the Learning Continuity Plan for 2020-2021 and how much of the total is tied to increasing or improving services for high needs students.

San Lucas Union Elementary School District plans to spend \$1,425,391.46 for the 2020-21 school year. Of that amount, \$190,501.00 is tied to actions/services in the Learning Continuity Plan and \$1,234,890.46 is not included in the Learning Continuity Plan. The budgeted expenditures that are not included in the Learning Continuity Plan will be used for the following:


General education teacher salaries and benefits; special education teacher salary and benefits; administration salary and benefits; clerical support staff salaries and benefits; the majority of the custodial staff salaries and benefits; the majority of the paraprofessional salaries and benefits; food service personnel salary and benefits; transportation personnel salary and benefits; after school program personnel salaries and benefits; materials and supplies related to education, maintenance, clerical, transportation, food service, and special education programs in the District; professional consulting including technology, legal, professional development, speech services, psychological services; liability insurance utilities; repairs; and rentals.

Increased or Improved Services for High Needs Students in in the Learning Continuity Plan for the 2020-2021 School Year

In 2020-21, San Lucas Union Elementary School District is projecting it will receive \$190,501.00 based on the enrollment of foster youth, English learner, and low-income students. San Lucas Union Elementary School District plans to spend \$190,501.00 towards meeting this requirement, as described in the Learning Continuity Plan.
